SLOW DOWN

Please do not burn any yard waste. Yard waste burning is only allowed between October 1 and April 30, as per Official Code of Cobb Co. Sec 54-116.

N E I G H B O R H O O D W A T C H

We, as Butler Creek homeowners, need to make every effort to keep our neighborhood safe. It is the actual WATCH that deters the crime. We need people, monitors, that will watch and call 9-1-1 whenever they see someone suspicious or

suspicious activity. Carry your cell phone with you while you're out walking. Drive to the pool on your way home at night. Watch your neighbor's home while they are away. Ask if you can bring in their mail and/or newspapers. Call the

police when you see suspicious activity. Report that we are a NWP neighborhood and you are calling in suspicious activity. Give details, what type/color of car and tag number, etc. We need your eyes, ears and telephones!

P O O L R U L E S

Usage of the pool and recreation areas is a privilege of each resident. Adult members are asked to take ownership, when the situation requires, in the pool and recreation areas. Violations of the rules can result in loss of pool privileges and retribution is expected for all damages incurred.

You must have a pool key to enter the pool area. Keys can be purchased from the HOA Board.

Swim at your own risk...NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY!

Entrance gate must remain closed at all times. *

Under age 14 years must be accompanied by a resident member adult age 18 years or older.

Guests may use the facilities when accompanied by a resident adult age 18 years or older.

No "solo" swimming. There must be at least two persons in the pool area. *

No diving into the pool.

No running, horseplay or throwing objects at anyone or anything.

No pets or glass items in the pool area.

Private parties at the pool or the pool area are not available.

Courteous and safe conduct is expected at all times.

No one under the influence of alcohol or drugs is allowed in the pool area. *

Courtesy and discretion is required in the use of rafts or floatation devices.

Foul, abusive and profane language is prohibited.

P A R K I N G O N S P T

Many homeowners have complained about several parked cars on Standing Peachtree Trail, during the day and at night, especially on the first curve and hill. Georgia state law requires cars to be parked 12" from the curb and facing the correct (direction) flow of traffic. Emergency vehicles need to be able to pass on the streets. Please make every effort to park in driveways or on the side streets.
