- **Have adult supervision.** Accompany your kids if you don't think they're old enough to trick-or-treat on their own.
- **There is safety in numbers.** If they're old enough to trick-or-treat without an adult, tell your kids to stay in a group.

- **Quality-check treats.** Check your kids' candy before they eat it. Throw out any candy that is not in its original wrapper or looks like it has been tampered with.
- **Obey the law.** Encourage your kids to follow all the regular rules for walking around. That includes looking both ways before crossing,!

A Message From the Cobb Police Dept. . .

We have received numerous complaints regarding vehicles parking in the street in the Butler Creek Sub Division. Usually, we only enforce this code section once a complaint has been made to 911 or if we find the parking to be a hazard to normal traffic on that roadway. Below is the code section regarding parking vehicles in the street. One thing to pay attention to is that no person shall park a vehicle on the street if it is practicable to park off the roadway. This is usually the case in most vehicles we find parking in the roadway. Within Butler Creek, we find that most vehicles that are parking in the street are doing so in a curve, on a hill or both. This violates the 200 feet visibility requirement. In any case, if an Officer finds that a vehicle that is parked in the street is causing a unsafe, hazardous situation then that vehicle can be removed from the roadway by towing. Please familiarize yourself with this code section.

O.C.G.A. 40-6-202. Stopping, standing, or parking outside of business or residential districts.

Outside of a business or residential district, no person shall stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon the roadway when it is practicable to stop, park, or so leave such vehicle off the roadway; but in every event, an unobstructed width of the highway opposite a standing vehicle shall be left for the free passage of other vehicles, and a clear view of the stopped vehicle shall be available from a distance of 200 feet in each direction upon the highway.
