

Drop off your gently used hardcover or paperback books, music CDs and DVD movies on Thursday and Friday, and receive a ticket redeemable for the same number of books, CDs and/or DVDs during the "open swap" on Saturday. Books must have the front and back covers intact and be in good condition. CDs and DVDs must be in their original cases and fully operable. Education

One of the most striking features of Kennesaw's growth over the last 25 years has been the advances in educational levels. In 1970, for example, about 20% of residents had only elementary school education while 6% (3,548 residents) were college graduates. Now the situation is reversed with 20% of city residents being college graduates and only 5% with elementary-level education. Although national educational levels have also risen since 1970, Kennesaw's levels have surpassed national, state and regional increases. Between 1980 and 1990 the percentage of high school graduates in Kennesaw grew by 27%, compared to 20% for the Atlanta Region, 18% for Cobb County and 13% for the United States.

Outdoor Burning Allowed October 1 – April 30

Open burning is allowed October 1 – April 30 of each year. During this time, <u>you may burn</u> limited yard debris (leaves, pine straw, and small limbs from growth on your property) and land clearing using an air curtain destructor. The following restrictions for burning also apply:

- Burning is allowed between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and one hour before sunset (no smoldering or hot coals remaining).
- No burning is allowed on windy days (10 mph or higher) or on days when the atmospheric conditions (cloudy, overcast, or raining) would cause the smoke to remain low to the ground. Cobb Fire uses wind speeds from McCollum Field, Dobbins AFB, and Brown Field to determine wind speed.
- Burning must be attended by an adult who must be watching the fire at all times. Never leave a fire unattended.
- A water hose long enough to reach the fire must be on hand, and be ready to use if needed.
- Fires may not be started with petroleum-based products
- Yard waste (small) fire must be at least 50 feet from all structures, including fences of combustible material, limbs no more than 6" diameter, pile not more than 6' x 6', at least 25' from roads with speed limits greater than 35 mph.
- Burning in a barrel is prohibited.
